Yeronga Community Centre

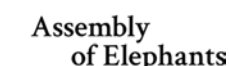
We work closely with the community centre to help those in need and bring people together, supporting each other and becoming a stronger and happier community.

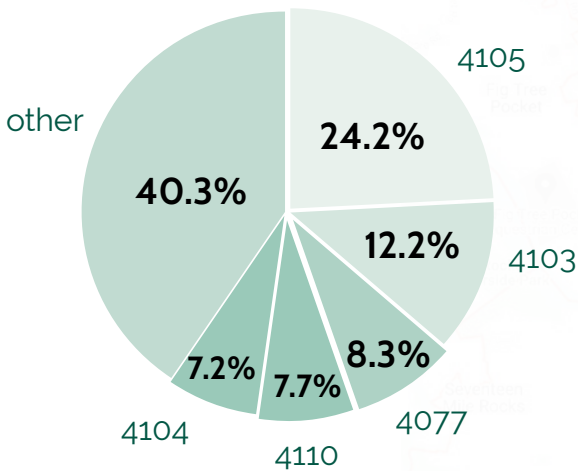

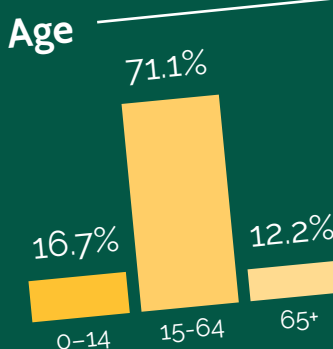
